Grudem, Wayne. 1 Peter. Grand Rapids: Wm. B. Eerdmands Publishing Co., 1998.

I found Grudem to be practical and concise. He detailed interpretational matters without being academic.

Hiebert, D. Edmond. 1 Peter. Winona Lake, IN: BMH Books, 1992.

Hiebert approached the original language with excellence; he was thorough in his study.

Jowett, J. H. The Epistles of Peter. Grand Rapids: Kregel Publications, 1993.

Jowett was heart-warming and pointed; this is an excellent commentary for application development.

Leighton, Robert. First Epistle of St. Peter, Vol. 1. London: James Duncan, 1830.

Leighton was a little archaic (for my personal taste) but thorough. I downloaded this commentary from Google Books.

Lenski, R. C. H. *The Interpretation of I and II Epistles of Peter, the Three Epistles of John, and the Epistle of Jude*. Minneapolis: Augsburg Publishing House, 1966.

Lenski's treatment of the original languages was the most helpful to me.

MacArthur, John. 1 Peter. Chicago: Moody Press, 2004.

MacArthur provided a wealth of cross-reference material that greatly aids the interpretational aspects that a preacher wants to develop in his message.

Meyer, F. B. *Tried by Fire: Expositions of the First Epistle of Peter*. New York: Fleming H. Revell Co., n.d.

In my opinion, this was my favorite commentary on 1 Peter. Meyer was heart-warming yet direct. While some of his specific applications were dated, the general applications were extremely helpful. Meyer wrote a lofty manner that elevated the book in the theme of grace which runs through 1 Peter.

Michaels, J. Ramsey. 1 Peter. Nashville: Thomas Nelson, 1988.

Michaels was a great resource for the more academic aspect of interpretations, although he and Grudem seemed to take shots at each other in their different interpretations.
