NO, ROMANS 10.17 -- SO FAITH COMES FROM HEARING, AND HEARING BY THE WORD OF CHRIST. / I DON'T BELIEVE THAT THE AUTHOR IS SAYING THAT THE BIBLE IS UNNECESSARY FOR SALVATION. ACCORDING TO ROMANS 10.17, THERE CANNOT BE FAITH WITHOUT THE GOSPEL IN THE SCRIPTURES. I BELIEVE THE AUTHOR'S POINT IS THAT A PERSON DOES NOT NEED TO READ THE BIBLE IN ORDER TO BE SAVED. [ALL OF ¶ BEGINNING, "IT IS NOT ABSOLUTELY NEEDFUL TO SALVATION THAT A MAN SHOULD READ THE BIBLE."]
