What Scriptural answers to prayer does the author use? PARTING OF RED SEA; SUN STOOD STILL; FIRE FROM THE SKY; AHITHOPHE'S COUNSEL REVERSED; DEFEAT OF SENNACHERIB'S ARMY. [¶ BEGINNING, "THERE ARE WONDERFUL EXAMPLES IN SCRIPTURE OF THE POWER OF PRAYER.", 5TH - 9TH SENTENCES]

What is most striking about Abraham's prayer for mercy?

GOD KEPT GIVING UNTIL ABRAHAM STOPPED ASKING. [¶
BEGINNING, "THERE ARE WONDERFUL EXAMPLES IN
SCRIPTURE OF THE POWER OF PRAYER.", 19TH & 20TH
SENTENCES]
