Why do we experience sorrow?

ANSWERS WILL VARY BUT SHOULD BE TO THE FOLLOWING EFFECT: CHRIST'S LOVE WAS AN INFINITE LOVE, THUS HIS SORROW WAS INCREDIBLY GREAT & CERTAINLY GREATER THAN THE TORTURE BEFORE AND DURING THE CRUCIFIXION. [¶ BEGINNING, "SOME WITHOUT A DOUBT HAVE A LARGER CUP OF SORROW TO DRINK THAN OTHERS.", LAST SENTENCE]

What "advice" does the psalmist give concerning sorrow?

"CALL UPON ME IN THE DAY OF TROUBLE, AND I WILL DELIVER THEE, AND THOU SHALT GLORIFY ME." ANSWERS SHOULD BE TO THE FOLLOWING EFFECT: WE ALWAYS HAVE TIME FOR WHAT IS MOST IMPORTANT TO US. [¶ BEGINNING "IT IS USELESS TO SAY YOU HAVE NO TIME", 5^{TH} & 6^{TH} SENTENCES]

What is one of the first evidences that the Spirit's movement appears to begin in a heart?

WHEN A PERSON FIRST PRAYS. [¶ BEGINNING "IN EVERY BUILDING THE FIRST STONE MUST BE LAID...", 5^{TH} & 6^{TH} SENTENCES]
